The National Curriculum has set out standards for the children to achieve by the end of the year.

- **Emerging** – working towards the statement. Developing understanding in this area.
- **Expected** – achieving at the expected level for their age.

Your child is exactly where they should be!

- **At Greater Depth** – has obtained a greater level of understanding and is able to apply their learning in different contexts.

No Child Left Behind

- Teaching and learning has been disrupted over the last two years.
- We will be observing and assessing the children more rigorously due to the gaps they have had in their learning.
- This will enable us to tailor the curriculum to meet their needs and provide additional support, where necessary.
- We will contact you if your child is identified as someone who needs extra support.

Inclusion

- If your child has additional special educational (SEN) needs, they will be supported by the Inclusion Team.
- They may have needs in the following areas:
 - Speech and Language
 - Cognition and Learning
 - Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs
 - Physical

Inclusion

- Children who have difficulties in the following areas may need targeted support such as:
 - Group interventions
 - External professionals
 - One to one intervention
 - Additional support in the classroom
 - Referral to outside agencies

The Inclusion team have regular meetings with Teachers and Teaching Assistants to ensure all children are supported appropriately.

Reading

- Comprehension sessions take place in the morning in whole class groups. Extra support for those who need it is available.
- Children change their reading books as they finish them, choosing from a wide range in the class book corners.
- Children should be reading **every day for 15-20 minutes** and commenting in their reading records. Reading records are checked daily by a member of the team.
- We also reward home reading using the reading challenge certificates.

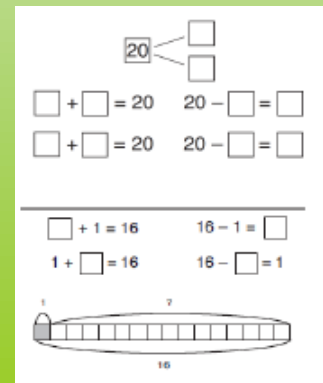
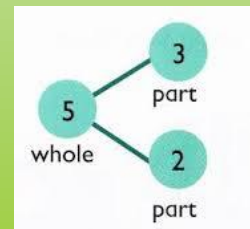

Maths

- We focus on:
 - Allowing children to experience maths rather than just see it.
 - Inviting children to explore maths and assisting with problem solving.
 - Encouraging children to talk about maths and develop their understanding independently.
 - Using concrete (objects e.g. counters, cubes) then pictorial (drawing pictures to support) then abstract (numerical) methods to calculate



Writing



- We inspire writing through quality literature.

Writing at Beckford:

- We encourage children to understand the **purpose** of their writing.
- We use **oracy** to allow children to articulate their ideas verbally before they write them down.
- We use **modelling** to show children the writing process.
- **Grammar** is built into our lessons.
- **Improvement** is a major part of our writing process – you will see your child's improvements in blue pen.

The West Hampstead Curriculum - A Guide for Parents in Year 5 – 2021-22

Over the past few months, we have been working on developing and improving our 'West Hampstead Curriculum'. This document shows you what children in Years 1-6 will be learning throughout the year and what your child will be learning in the Autumn term. You will receive more information later in the year.

Intent - The West Hampstead Curriculum is designed to:

1. Teach our pupils to learn well
2. Teach our pupils how to lead happy, healthy, constructive lives, in which they can aspire and experience success
3. Ensure broad and balanced knowledge of the world
4. Ensure high levels of competence in the core subjects of English and maths
5. Teach our pupils to live well in a diverse world, as confident, responsible citizens

West Hampstead Values:

Last year, we worked with children, staff, parents and governors to develop our five core West Hampstead values , Aspiration, Responsibility, Resilience, Consideration and Community. These themes run through each of our topics.

Whole School Themes:

As a school community, we have decided to structure our Key Stage 1 and 2 'West Hampstead Curriculum' around whole school themes. These themes are: Journeys, Making a Difference, Environment and Diversity.

The National Curriculum:

At our school the National Curriculum is statutory. It lays out the range of subjects we must teach and sets the standards pupils are expected to reach at the end of each key stage of learning. Our Schools Curriculum incorporates the National Curriculum and goes beyond it. We have adapted and extended the National Curriculum to meet the particular needs of our pupils and families. It is a curriculum designed to work for all in our community.

Topic Enrichment

We believe that all topics should be memorable, engaging and exciting! So for each topic you will see that (Covid permitting) we have planned for: an exciting entry point, opportunities for exploration through in depth research , exciting trips and an exit point that will often involve sharing work with our community.

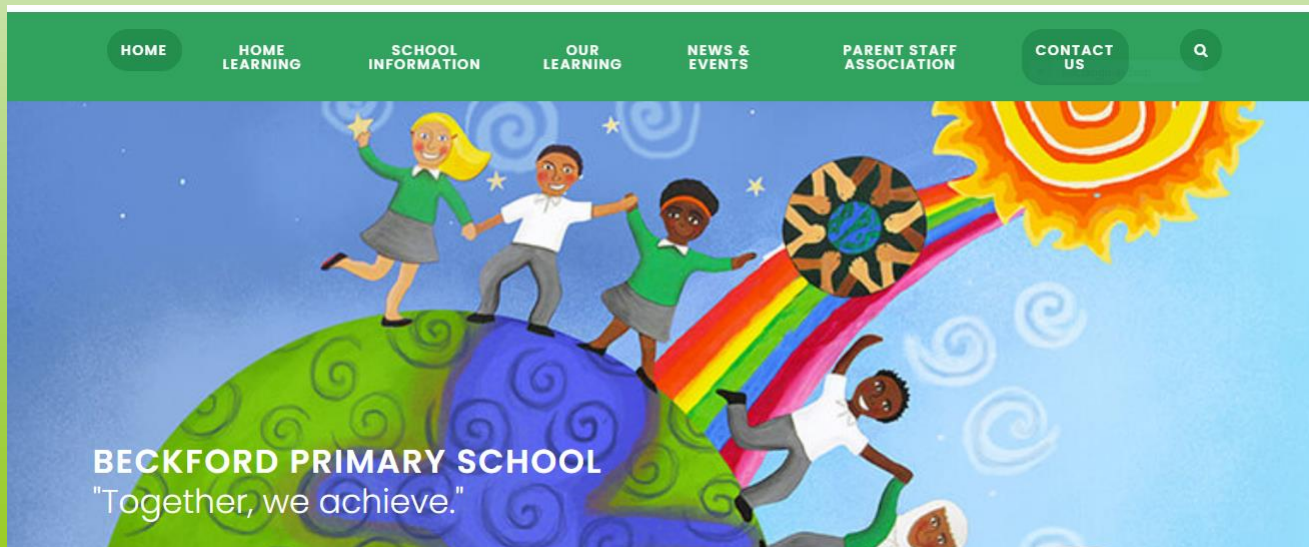
Year 5 Topic Map – Autumn Term 2
