Phonics

What is phonics and how do we teach it at West Hampstead?



Phonics is the method of learning to read by correlating sounds with letters/sets of letters. At West Hampstead, we use a scheme called **Little**Wandle Letters & Sounds Revised to teach phonics in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

- Children have daily phonics lessons that increase in length from Reception Year 2
- All teachers and support staff have a consistent approach and use of resources
- We follow a progression that enables children to build their knowledge and begin reading and writing simple words, phrases and sentences as soon as possible.
- Lots of opportunity for repeated practice within the classroom provision

Supporting at home

- Daily reading practice using the decodable book provided by the class teacher (recommended 3 times per book). This will correlate with sounds and tricky words that children have learnt in school.
- 'Words of the week' handout. Give your child opportunity to revise the sounds they have learnt in school that week. Display the sounds/words and encourage them to read them back to you. Writing practice using the sounds/words of the week will also benefit your child.
